AGM Treasurer's Report (Financial Year 2019 - 2020)

TTAA's bank balance at the end of this financial year was \$12794.62. This gave us a loss of \$91.41.

Income was from memberships, the sale of Diane May's books and CD's, and TTAA course manuals.

An accidental deposit was made by Virginnia Kingsford and this was reimbursed. Promotion via Facebook using Social Media Specialist, Sarah Kempson's (Gevaux) services was the largest expenditure. Other expenditure included reimbursement for grocery costs for the Executive Committee Retreat, the TTIA affiliation fee, and website domain name and hosting fees. Three credit card transactions necessitated using Square and incurred small transaction fees.

A small loss was incurred in the difference between the actual postage paid and postage charged on the order form to send out books. We have since increased the cost of postage on our order form.

The Education fund has a balance of \$1426.00. This financial year saw \$360 deposited for training manuals, and \$500 granted to Virginnia Kingsford to attend the TTIA conference.

The ANZ bank continues to waive the \$22.00 per month account service fee.

I would again like to acknowledge the donations that TTAA Executive Committee members make to keep running costs down. For example; paying their travel costs to get to the

Executive Retreat, and for supplying stationery etc.

The exciting news is TTAA Executive has accepted a proposal to build a new user and administrator friendly website. 'Incredible Communications' will build the website and educate us how to manage and use it effectively. In the past year some changes were made to the current website.

These included the addition of a Complaints page, and reorganisation of the contents under the Education drop down menu. The Complaints page is located under the Practitioners drop down menu, and lists entities where health care complaints can be directed in each state and territory. TT training program course dates have been updated as required.

The domain name fee of \$70.95 for 2 years was paid in November 2019, and the website hosting annual fee of \$109.95 was paid in December 2019.

The Teachers Group has met by Skype /Zoom three times since June 18, 2019.

Overview of TT teaching programs this year

Jane taught a Foundations (Basic) and Transpersonal (Intermediate) course in Perth in November 2019. A very successful Serenity Settling Workshop was also offered which provides a good introduction to using TT in Aged Care. We are hopeful that several participants will continue on into the Foundations course in due time.

It was exciting to see four students graduate from the 2018-2019 Mentorship Course and one of them become a member of TTAA Executive. Several others are applying for accreditation as a QTTPA.

Five students started the 2020-2021 Mentorship Course in March. This course has been innovative as it has been by Zoom and involved students from Perth and Melbourne. This group of mentorees is particularly blessed with additional mentoring. Peta Nottle and Virginnia Kingsford have participated as very effective mentors to the group. The course will need to extend longer than 12 months to accommodate the effects of COVID19.

Gerry has taught a TT Foundations course in 2019. Plans for a TTF course in 2020 with the local U3A 'Mind, Body, Spirit' group are on hold until after Covid19.

Foundations of TT On-line

The Covid 19 Global Pandemic has interrupted plans for face to face teaching of TT in 2020. In response to this a TT Foundations Online course was advertised in June 2020 and a good level of interest was shown, however feedback regarding a change in format has meant the course has been postponed until August/September 2020. Interest has come from NSW, Queensland, WA and Victoria.

The course will be offered by Jane and Virginnia, with support from Margaret who may also participate if not on leave. Virginnia is engaged in creating some teaching videos and we are working on the best ways to teach the practice component. Experience from the Mentorship Program has shown that the theory and meditative practice can be taught with ease on line.

This is very new ground and we are excited about exploring the possibilities. Even after Covid 19 to be able to offer TT this way across Australia would be wonderful. Costs could be reduced and accessibility greatly increased.

We are aware that plans for On-line TT are also in hand in Germany, Canada and USA.

TT Teacher training and Support

Margaret Graham, and Virginnia Kingsford are now Level 2 QTTTA teachers and are working towards completing Level 1 with Jane. Virginnia ran her first full TT Foundations Course which went very well. She is also participating in mentoring in the Mentorship Course as part of her training.

Teacher supports - Marg is putting together a Teachers package containing guidelines and support documents for TT teachers.

Promoting TT Education to the wider community

We are now using Facebook to advertise TT Courses both on individual Facebook pages and through the private and public TTAA pages. This has been limited due to Facebook changes and charges and our need for a new website. Once the new TTAA website is completed then it will be much easier to contact those in our mailing list via Mail Chimp, plus present TT to the public.

Attending networking events and word of mouth remain the most effective way of sparking interest and enrolments in courses. We would like to commend the work of Peta Nottle and the Healing Insights team in WA for their amazing networking. Plans are in place for Jane to present to a Dementia group in WA in November with Peta local TT mentorees. Virginnia is to present TT to the Reflexology Association in Victoria next year.

TTAA Education Program

The TTAA Education Program and Professional Pathway is working well. The option to deliver the three choices of TT for Family and Friends (2 days) and then TT for Professional development or as part of the QTTPA training with full competency

assessment (both 3 day series) has worked well. Having the two day exit point is very popular. It is great to see that all the work on the Education program and materials over the last 8 years with all its challenges, disappointments and growth has come to fruition. We now have a very sound, workable and professional program and accreditation process which are in line with TTIA international standards.

The Transpersonal Dimensions of Therapeutic Touch (Intermediate Level) Manual has been completed. Now we have the content well in hand it is planned that the format of the Transpersonal and Foundations level manuals will be updated and modernized over the next 12 months. We are fortunate in having Cynthia Bartolo on the Executive. Cynthia has significant expertise in this area.

The Mentorship Manual is being upgraded again as the 2020-2021 course progresses. By the end of the Mentorship Course workshops in March 2021 the Manual will be complete. The combination of Learning Packages, Mentorship Workshops and Assessment Exercises makes for a very full course, but leads to significant personal and professional development.

A teachers and mentors group formed in June with Jane Hall, Virginnia Kingsford, Peta Nottle, Sue Gregory and Gerry Milton. This group meets once a month, the day after each Mentorship Workshop to review the progress of the Mentorship Course and to work on the development of new material. The commitment of time and work by all is very much appreciated.

There has been a request from Canada to buy some of our education materials the Foundations level Booklet and Manual. TTAA Executive is still considering how we may do this while remaining in clear ownership of the content.

Professional Development Program

PDP Points System

Virginina and Gerry have finalized a Professional Development Points system for launching this month. A lot of work has been done in this area over the years so it is great to see this come to fruition. Thanks to all those who have participated over that time. There is now a requirement that all accredited QTTTA and QTTPA's undertake 10 points worth of professional development each year to maintain their accreditation with TTAA. Other members of TTAA are encouraged to also seek ongoing development in TT and related areas. Everyone can use this program as a guide for keeping informed and up to date.

TT Practice groups have continued in Perth, Seaford and Melbourne, in 2020 in person and where necessary by Zoom. Special thanks to Alina Gorris for organizing the Melbourne Group and to Peta Nottle for Perth. Gerry's work over many years at Seaford is such a special contribution to the TT Community.

TT Chat Group is a great innovation started by Virginnia Kingsford. This has been a great success where members can connect in via Zoom to chat and share regularly. The depth of sharing and connection has been impressive.

Ongoing Education and Professional Development Events

Due to Covid19 plans for our next TTAA Retreat have gone on hold. We are exploring options for online events using some of the wonderful materials from International Conferences. Sue Gregory has also offered her materials and recordings from Indralaya of Dee and Dora.

Accreditation of Teachers and Practitioners

The Policies and Procedures plus application forms for Accreditation of qualified teachers and practitioners have been finalized. A procedure document related to processing of applications has also been formulated for TTAA.

Applications for both have been received by Virginnia Kingsford and are being processed.

In conclusion, many many thanks must go to all those who have contributed to TT Education over this last year. Looking over this report it is clear just how much work has been done and just how ready we are to take TT Education out into the community.
